& I was pleased to hear you were all
well as this leaves me not to bad & Bill
& Janice grand I had not been to good
since Mam passed away, but I am doing
better I am eating better. Yes dears it was
a shock it come that sudden, but mind
you Mam has been ill for a long time
but would not give in & on Thursday Feb 2
she was at the neighbours about 5 pm having
a cuppa & a natter, she was not to well all
day & had the pains more often. I brought
the bed down into the kitchen on account of
old, she went to bed as usual & about
10 pm she had a very bad attack, I got Mrs
Bynolds the neighbours in & phoned for the
doctor, when I come back from Phoning
they were each having a cup of Tea & Mam
looked none the worse, it had happened
like that for a few weeks, but usually
he got off to sleep afterwards, the doc
come about 11-30 pm, he examined her & said

her heart was steady, he gave her a injection
& told us it would give some rest, he nipped
her nose & said now get off to sleep & it
will do you good & he left after 12
at about 1 Am she had another attack
& I was helpless she tossed from one
side of the bed to the other, saying
(I dont know gke) many times I helped
her as much as I could, she passed away
at about 1-40 AM, I couldnt realize she had
passed away & it has given me a shock
I am picking up a bit now. You will
wonder why we have moved down
here. Well Ray got Bill work down
at Royston as a cleaner before
Christmas & also this house was for
sale so they got it & of course we had
to sell the one at Barbisle I got it sold
just before mam passed away, we intended
to move & all arrangements were made
to move on Monday Feb 6th, nearly every
thing was packed & we were all looking
forward to the change, & Ray & Vera are

glad + pleased that we come as I have ^{said} +
Mam took a bad turn (one of many of
recent months) + passed away on Friday 3rd Feb
D + Leo Johnson came at 11-30pm + I have
already told you what happened. I had to call
him again, + he was most sorry at the sudden
collapse, + did the arrangements for me
early next morning, sent Telegrams for
